Administrative Appeal Decision

The Appellant submitted an administrative appeal request regarding the state hearing decision issued on December 2, 2005. However, it appears from the administrative appeal request that the Appellant does not disagree with the state hearing decision. The state hearing decision sustained the Appellant's food stamp, Medicaid and Disability Financial Assistance appeals, ordering the Agency to reinstate the Appellant's food stamps and to assist the Appellant in obtaining the medical evidence necessary to submit to CMS. As the Appellant's appeals were sustained, no further relief is available to the Appellant at this time.

Decision

Having, reviewed the state hearing decision and record, we find the decision contains no error affecting the outcome of the appeal. Accordingly, we hereby ORDER that the decision be AFFIRMED.
